Note: Currently we are supporting Google Blogger Accounts – other accounts can be integrated as well


Step 1. – Setup your blog on blogger.co m – choose a name and make note:

In my example I called it beadsmithbeta

And my url or website will be Beadsmithbeta.blogspot.com

Choose a template

And you are ready to post.



Optional – if you don't like the headers at the top of the blog – you can remove them


By going to template → customize → advanced → Add Css

And adding the following: (THIS IS OPTIONAL)

navbar { display: none; }


#navbar-iframe { display: none !important; }

.global-nav { display: none !important; }




Step 2. – Add the Remotenet Link Code to the Blogger Site as a Widget

Choose Layout → add a gadget



Choose html/javascript:




Enter a Name - RNSearchTool


Cut and paste the content

<script src="http://hosting.tshinc.com/all_scripts/tsh_blog.js" type="text/javascript"></script>

Note: this is hosted at tsh – if you want/need to host it locally you can download and change the links



Verify your widget shows on the layout...




Save your changes .

Step3. Adding links to remotenet:

Note these links will only work when logged into the site on the blog page

Add a new post choose HTML to enter the code directly..

The links should always have

javascript:SearchTool('[CODE FROM RN]')

Note the use of 'and " – this can be a little confusing – but each link is encapsulated.


'browsepath("BRC","||035")' – is a function in RN that does a search, each code and piece allows for a different product search.

Here are some of the codes: "SR" is a normal search, BRC, BRS, BRSC are browsing to a specific product type, class or category
